



#### Directions to the meeting:

Turn right on Olalla Valley Road and go .5 miles and turn left on Ebbert (careful here this is a blind corner!). Go another .5 of mile and turn left on Raven Ridge Place SE. Go another .3 of a mile to Glacier Ridge Place. Maury and Sandy's house is right on the corner, park creatively.

From the Southworth Ferry Dock take first left after leaving the dock area, Sedgwick Road. Go 2.3 miles and turn LEFT on Banner Road (There is a right on Banner Road .1 of mile prior to the left, but if you take this right you will be terminally lost). Go 2.1 miles and turn right on Olalla Valley Road. Go 1.2 miles and turn right on Ebbert. Go another .5 of mile and turn left on Raven Ridge Place SE. Go another .3 of a mile to Glacier Ridge Place. Maury and Sandy's house is right on the corner, park creatively.







# The All City Rally XXVI

The twenty-sixth annual running of this 75-mile

gimmick type Road Rally will be Sunday, April 23, 2006, rain or shine. Start any time between 9:00 AM and noon from Gould Chiropractic Center, 704 South Lilly Rd., Olympia, Wash. Take exit 109 (Martin Way) off Interstate-5, west on Martin Way, left on Lilly Rd., over freeway bridge and left into start. Finish and awards will be at a food-and-drink establishment in the Olympia area.

This is an Open Event for ALL street-legal vehicles. Current registration and proof of insurance required at the start! Put them in your car now, thank you very much. Cars also get a brief safety/tech inspection (lights, horn, signals, seat belts, etc.) The rally is sponsored by Corvettes de Olympia, co-sanctioned by Northwest Region, Sports Car Club of America. Many Miata teams have participated (with varying success!) for the last few years. Cars with driver & navigator follow a confusing route around country roads and try to find the answers to obscure questions about things you see along the way (sort of a motorized scavenger hunt). The teams that get the most answers right win trophies at the finish. It's not a show, not a speed event, and uses all paved roads.

The All City Rally is a fun way to get out on the back roads and start the South Sound motorsports "season" with other cool car enthusiasts. There are dash plaques for every car, and dual trophies (driver and navigator) for the top five teams, plus the dreaded Dead Last But Finished award. Great huge piles of door prizes are given away (one ticket with your entry and you may buy lots more.) Your entire entry fee (\$15/car) goes to the Corvettes de Olympia Scholarship Fund for students in the automotive curriculum at South Puget Sound Community College. Last year CdeO awarded \$1500 in scholarships and the college matched the amount!

There will also be a Spec Miata class. Races are held throughout the weekend with the Rose Cup Race starting at 1:40 p.m., Sunday, June 11.

We've barely started 2006, and the autocrossers of PSMC have been busy already. First up was the first WWSCC Slush event, "Dawg Sled". January 22 was actually

# A Face That Will Be Missed

[I promised Gayle that I would write something up for the Sounder as we lost George to ALS on January 20<sup>th</sup>. I'm probably not the best to do him justice as my time as his friend was too short, but I'll do my best.]



What can I tell you about George? I can tell you that he was born in Brooklyn, New York on January 8, 1945 to George and Barbara Lazur; that he served his country during the Vietnam Era as a Captain in the US Army, receiving the Vietnam Service Medal, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal and the Bronze Star. I can tell you that he fell in love with California during his stint at Fort Ord and decided to stay in the area after his years of military service were over. I can tell you that he worked in the insurance field; in fact, he met Gayle when she was working as a Kelly temp at the insurance agency where he was a claims manager. They were married on August 9, 1986 in Lake Tahoe, CA, which was also the last place they were able to vacation together in September 2005. I can tell you that George and Gayle moved to Washington on April 15, 1996 and that he was working as a Market Conduct Examiner in the Office of the Insurance Commissioner for the State of Washington when he retired in October 2005. And I can tell you that he was an avid car enthusiast; the list of cars he owned goes on forever and ranges from a Alfa Romeo Giuletta to an AMC AMX in Big Bad Orange to a Ford Zephyr to a BMW 325iT. His favorite of all, though, was the Corvette, which, unfortunately, he never had the opportunity to own; however, he did collect a much smaller version of the car, which he proudly displayed in his home in Edmonds. That's not to say he didn't love the Miata. Over time he owned four, buying his first in 1989 (a Red), to be followed by the Merlot Mica, a 10AE and finally a 2001 Crystal Blue. He

and Gayle joined PSMC in 1996, hosted a Miata Fun Run in Edmonds and he became a Director at Large in 2002. And finally, I can tell you that he was diagnosed with ALS July 2002 and his time on Earth was not long enough, for at 5:30 AM on Friday, January 20 2006, George Lazur passed away peacefully in his sleep after a long, hard battle with ALS (Lou's Gehrig Disease).

All these facts, though, are just that: facts, milestones that we all go through in life, and while those facts may tell you where George has been and what he has done, they don't tell you what kind of a man he was. In my short time of knowing him, I found George Lazur to be an inspiration in the face of adversity; he was kind, loving, warm, generous, strong and had a heart of gold. He never once lost his sense of humor during his trials and tribulations with ALS, even to the point of telling jokes and giving Gayle a hard time right up until the very end. ALS may have slowed his body down, but it didn't slow him down. He and Gayle continued to show up to numerous PSMC events, planning meetings and were always one of the first to volunteer or show up to help at PSMC Hosted events. His strength and determination to live life to its fullest (which he did better than some able-bodied adults I know) amazed me. He will go down in my book as a character I will never forget. My life was enriched by my having known him and his absence from it now will be forever missed.


